The City of Olathe, Kansas Has Awarded Transportation Logistics Management, Inc. a Three Year Contract Extension for Freight Services.

OLATHE, Kansas (June 17, 2010)-In a continued effort to maximize budgetary dollars, The City of Olathe has extended their Freight Services Contract with Transportation Logistics Management for three years.

Taking advantage of the program developed and offered by TLM, known as the "5 Easy Steps", the City of Olathe was able to generate savings of more than 40% on freight charges, associated with the commodities they purchased through their various vendors.

With input from procurement professionals throughout the United States, Transportation Logistics Management has developed a simple program designed specifically for procurement departments who have historically allowed their vendors to "control" the freight process. TLM's "5 Easy Steps" is designed to substantially reduce inbound freight costs of the items that are buried in the cost of the items purchased, at a significantly inflated rate. Throughout the US, this program is providing savings of 30, 40 & 50% or more with little or no work on the part of the procurement department.

TLM has met with over 500 procurement groups and organizations and over 1,800 procurement professionals during the past 18 months to solicit advice, receive input on the program and obtain validation in the development of this program.

Since January 2009, TLM has participated in, presented at and/or providing training for a wide range of procurement groups across the country. Interaction at each of these events afforded TLM the opportunity to discuss the common needs of procurement groups and to integrate the information gleaned from these meetings in developing and providing a first in industry service and system designed for procurement groups by procurement groups.

TLM's current relationships and contracts include numerous city, county, state governments, universities, prison systems and school districts throughout the US and continue to grow as the program develops.

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
